- Key partners:
  - Shaw Circle, a FinTech start-up private fund manager founded by graduates of the University of South Carolina Columbia
  - FinTrust, a Greenville, SC based investment advisory firm
  - The South Carolina Quantum Association, a Columbia, SC non profit that stimulates collaboration among academia, entrepreneurs, industry, and government

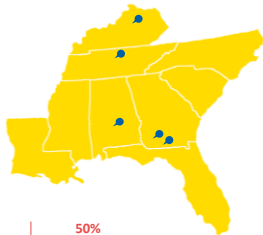

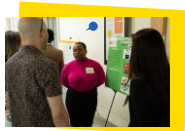
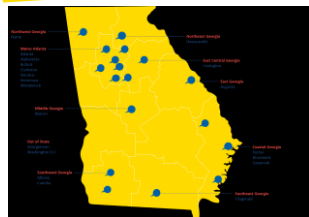

### 2024 PIN Summer Internship

- 13 alumni and 26 new organizations
- 2 Anchor Partners

- 1 Build Your Own Project (BYOP)

### PIN Summer Internship

The 2024 Intern Cohort includes:

- 80 Interns (27% increase from last year) from 23 universities across 48 majors, 9 states and 19 countries
- 10% of interns are from rural communities, 42% Pell eligible and 36% First-generation college students
- 401 applications (20% acceptance rate) from 57 universities across 121 majors, 20 states and 32 countries
- Projected student hours: 38,000+

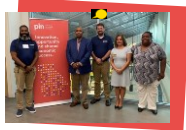

## Community Research Grants

A cohort-based program that supports local governments, multidisciplinary researchers and teams to implement innovative projects for transformational change.

Program Highlights:

- Local Government and University Researcher Teams
- Competitive program, next proposal window Feb-May 2025
- \$100,000 for a 1-year project, funds split between the partners
- Projects should pilot technology & innovation to solve community problems
- PIN can help provide introductions to researchers who can suggest solutions and help design a project, including help with the proposal

### Community Research Grants

A cohort-based program that supports local governments, multidisciplinary researchers and teams to implement innovative projects for transformational change

#### Past Funded Projects

- City of Albany 2018: Developed an automated housing registry
- City of Woodstock 2019: Smart Woodstock transportation masterplan and smart corridor study
- City of Valdosta 2020: Smart traffic monitoring and communication system with signal preemption for emergency vehicles
- Pike & Spalding County 2021: Advancing community connectivity with broadband
- City of Atlanta 2022: Innovative energy auditing practice with drones, followed by energy efficiency upgrades and education for homeowners

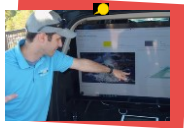

- Columbus & Warner Robins
  - Profiled, published and academically recognized
  - Applied for the SMART 20 Awards, which Valdosta won in 2021
- Woodstock and Warner Robins mayors to attend Taipei Smart City Summit & Expo, competing for the Intelligent Community Forum Awards
- PIN positioned these projects for international acclaim by demonstrating digital twinning as a powerful tool for community resilience

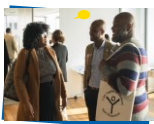

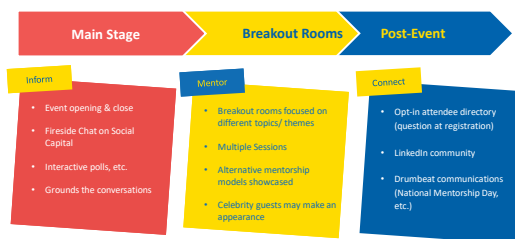
